With the MoU, businesses can secure GECA and Eco Choice Aotearoa certifications simultaneously or efficiently add the second certification, reducing costs and administrative complexity. This collaboration further cements the two lifecycle ecolabels' trans-Tasman commitment to sustainability and responsible production underpinned by GEN's rigorous standards.

### saveBOARD: A Circular Economy Leader

Known for its innovative building materials made from recycled content, saveBOARD champions the circular economy, diverting waste from landfill and reducing embodied carbon in the built environment. The company is also committed to ensuring the safety of materials used in its products and maintaining fair working conditions.

As part of the certification journey, saveBOARD has achieved a lifecycle ecolabel that validates its strong sustainability claims. This dual certification simplifies the process for saveBOARD to expand its leadership across Australia and New Zealand, including projects such as <u>Bega's Centre for Circularity</u> in Victoria, where saveBOARD products are specified.
